

## Plantings, Memorials & Markers

The landscaping of the entire cemetery is under the direction of the Public Works Director and the Cemetery Sexton. The cemetery Sexton or Public Works Director may remove from any lot, without notice, any of the above articles and any artificial or natural flowers which may be objectionable or become unsightly. The cemetery reserves the right to trim and or remove any planting deemed necessary for the benefit of the cemetery.

#### MEMORIALS

Only one marker shall be allowed per grave, set in accordance with the rules of the cemetery. Every memorial of any type will require an adequate concrete foundation, with at least a minimum 5" wash or overhang.

Monuments or markers placed in the center stone row are not limited in size, but monuments or markers placed in the headstone rows shall be of a size no larger than 16" high by 36" long and 12" wide/depth for a single space and 16" high by 48" long and 12" wide/depth for a double space. A double marker covering two spaces constitutes two markers. No monuments, markers or burials shall be placed in the walkways.

### DECORATIONS

- No more than two decorations on any marker or monument are permitted.
- All decorations, including solar lights and annual flowers, must be in a pot, and placed on an approved upright support and placed within 6" of the memorial.
- No glass vases or containers are allowed.
- No decorations, with the exception of a 3" picture or a 3" military emblem, shall be allowed on the panel of a niche or on the columbarium and columbarium niches shall be engraved according to cemetery rules.
- No grave blankets
- No planting may be done without preapproval. This includes but is not limited to, hedges, trees, bushes, annual flowers.
- No chairs or settees.
- No shells or toys or any other articles that are deemed inconsistent with the proper keeping of the cemetery.

#### Summer decorations must be removed by November 11<sup>th</sup>, Veterans Day. No winter decorations may be installed until the Monday before Thanksgiving.

#### Winter decorations must be removed by April 15th

No decorations, other than fresh cut flowers may be placed on any grave <u>until four days prior to Memorial Day</u>. Any decorations placed prior to this date may be removed without notice. All winter decorations must be on an approved upright support.

The cemetery assumes no liability for damage to the property of lot owners. The cemetery assumes no responsibility for any damage to any live plants. The cemetery staff shall in turn exercise due regard and make all attempts to prevent damage to any plantings, provided they have been placed in accordance with the above said rules.
