- Bank of New Glarus construction is well underway and work on a new Assisted

- Evansville Aquatic Center and Veterans Memorial Splashpad will open in June.

2026 Capital Projects

- Longfield Street will be fully reconstructed starting this month. Work will include replacement of underground water and sewer utilities, extension of stormwater to address water concerns, and installation of new road base, curbs, and pavement. Sidewalks will be spot repaired
- The lift station on Lincoln Street near Higgins Drive will also be fully rebuilt this year. This lift station is integral to getting sanitary sewer waste from this neighborhood all the way back to the treatment plan on Water Street for processing.
- You've certainly seen the local vehicle registration fee on your registration renewal forms from the state. This fee can be used for road maintenance and we specifically direct it preserving and refurbishing the pavement surface on streets that do not need significant underground utility work. This year, the fee will pay for:
 - Resurfacing Lincoln Street from Higgins to Second Street
 - Resurfacing Countryside Drive from Main Street to Greenview
 - Repaving alley between First and Second Streets
 - Chip sealing other roads to preserve their longevity.
