



2026 BUDGET:


General Fund expenditures will total \$4,932,840, an increase of \$88,711 or 1.9% from 2025.

The department maintains city facilities, parks, roadways, stormwater, wastewater, electric, and water operations.

Brush/Yard Waste Pick-Up

Information can be found at www.evansvillewi.gov/refuse. Brush/Yard waste pick up occurs **from April 6th through October 9th**. Municipal services staff will perform yard waste pickups once each month during the first full week. All yard waste must be on the terrace **not in the street**, and brush must be stacked in bundles (no longer than 6' and no larger than 6" in diameter). All yard waste must be on the terrace by Monday morning at 8am of the pick-up week.

Brush/Yard Waste Drop-Site & E-Waste

Brush and yard waste can also be dropped off at the City Brush/Yard Waste Drop-site located 465 Water Street (next to the Fire Department.) **The site is open on Wednesdays from 5pm to 7pm from April 1st until October 28th and Saturdays from 9am to 2:30pm April 4th through November 21st.** Non-city residents may purchase a permit at City Hall to access the site. An electronics Dumpster for city residents is also available at this site for no charge.

A list of the most common electronic devices are as follows: Consumer computers, Computer peripherals (i.e. keyboards, mouse, etc...), Televisions and other video display devices, Fax machines, VCRs and DVD players, Consumer printers, Phones with video displays (i.e. cell phones).

**Please refer to Wisconsin State Statute 287.07(5)(a) for the complete list of electronic devices that are regulated under this law.*

Tax Bills & Lottery Credit

City taxes are collected by the Rock County Treasurer's Office between the hours of 8 a.m. - 5 p.m., Monday - Friday. *Their offices will be closed Wednesday, Dec. 24th; Thursday, Dec. 25th; Thursday, Jan. 1st; & Monday Jan. 19th.*

Full or first installment payments are due on or before January 31, 2026. Checks **must** be made payable to the **Rock County Treasurer** and mailed to 51 S Main Street, Janesville, WI 53545-3951. Include the top portion of your tax bill with your payment. Please reference your parcel number on any correspondence. Payment can be made by check, money order, or pay by Credit Card or Electronic Check using GovTech Services on the Rock County website, charges apply. Go to www.co.rock.wi.us/ and click on Treasurer. If paying in cash, pay with the correct amount as the bank is no longer able to get pennies.

***If you are requesting a receipt, please enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope.**

If you owned your home on January 1, 2025, and it is your primary residence, you are eligible for a lottery and gaming credit. If you do not see one on your tax statement, please contact the Rock County Treasurer's Office before you make payment.

Property Fraud Alert

Register of Deeds Sandy Disrud Announces Free Service **Property Fraud Alert**

Property Fraud Alert is a FREE early warning service offered through the Rock County Register of Deeds. Property owners can subscribe to be alerted whenever there is recording activity associated with their name, whether it be a fraudulent deed, a lien on their property, or a legitimate document. Owners are notified by phone, email, or text. Visit the website www.propertyfraudalert.com or call 800-728-3858 for more information and to register.

We are hearing about more cases of deed fraud across the country. **Property Fraud Alert** gives property owners the beneficial advantage of early notification.

Floodplain and Flooding Information

Information on whether your property is in the 100-year floodplain can be obtained at City Hall. The Community Development Director can help you. Maps are available to look at, as well as other flood-related information. The City also maintains elevation certificates for construction in 2009 and newer. Call (608) 882-2263 for more information.

**If you are building in the floodplain, purchase of flood insurance is mandatory if using a federally regulated/insured bank for a loan. Visit www.evansvillewi.gov/flooding for more information.*

Flooding and Stormwater

The Public Works staff of the Municipal Services Department inspects streams, ditches, ponds, and culverts on a regular basis. If you see a local flooding or drainage problem that needs attention, please call 882-2270.

Address Numbers

Many homes replaced siding this year following the April hailstorm. Residents are reminded to re-attach their address numbers if they haven't already.

Address numbers must:

- Be at least 3 inches tall
- Be distinctly legible
- Contrast in color from the background
- Be posted in a conspicuous place on the front of each house/building/premise, easily seen from the road

EMS, Police, Water & Light employees, USPS, and delivery drivers rely on these numbers to provide service.



2026 Animal Licenses

According to State Statute and City of Evansville Ordinance 2015-01, all dogs, cats and exotic animals must be licensed annually. 2026 licenses are available after December 15, 2025. Licenses can be applied for at the City Clerk's Office. A current rabies certificate from your Veterinarian is required when applying for the license. Fees are as follows:

Unaltered Animals	\$15.00
Spayed or Neutered	\$ 8.00
Exotic Animals	\$ 8.00
Licensed Boarder	\$75.00

* Late fee applied after March 31st.

Per City Ordinance, a fine may

be imposed by the Police Department

if an unlicensed animal is picked-up and held at our local pound. **Be sure to take your licensed animal to our Dog Park located at 535 S Madison Street!**



Reserve Park Shelters & Athletic Fields

Fields must be reserved and paid for separately. Rental of one does not automatically result in the use of the other. Reservations can be made starting January 2nd of each year. The rental fee must be received by the City Clerk's Office to hold the reservation. Shelters can be reserved at: evansvillewi.recdesk.com/

Motor Vehicle Registration and Licensing

Vehicle title, registration/renewal services are available for walk-in customers. Plates or stickers are given to the customer upon completion of the transaction. Titles are printed and mailed from the WI Dept. of Transportation. These services are available during office hours. Office hours adjust according to staffing levels but are typically Monday – Friday from 7:00am – 5:00pm.

Prescription Drug Drop-Off

A permanent drop-off box to provide citizens of Rock County with an easy, secure, and responsible way to dispose of unused, unwanted, and expired prescription drugs is available 24/7 on the east side of the building, between the Police Station and City Hall. Sharps, liquids, and needles are prohibited.

Vacation Watch

Citizens of Evansville may request a security check be conducted of their residence while they are away on vacation. A form can be obtained at the Evansville Police Department or on the city's website to request this service.



Winter Parking Restrictions

The City has replaced alternate side parking with a Snow Emergency Declaration as needed. Winter parking regulations and snow emergency information can be found by visiting: www.evansvillewi.gov/snow

How will this affect you?

During a declared snow emergency all vehicles must be removed off the roadways or face a fine of \$100 plus removal of the vehicle by a towing company at the vehicle owner's expense

How will you know when a snow emergency is declared?

The Municipal Services Department will put out a press release in advance of the snow emergency. The press release will be posted on the City Website, Facebook, and sent to local media outlets.

Where do you park during a snow emergency if you don't have a driveway?

The ordinance allows for you to park in any city municipal parking lot without a required permit while a snow emergency is declared. City municipal lots are accessed from Maple St, Montgomery Ct, and W Church St

When can I park my vehicle back on the street?

Vehicles can be parked back on the street after the declaration expires.
