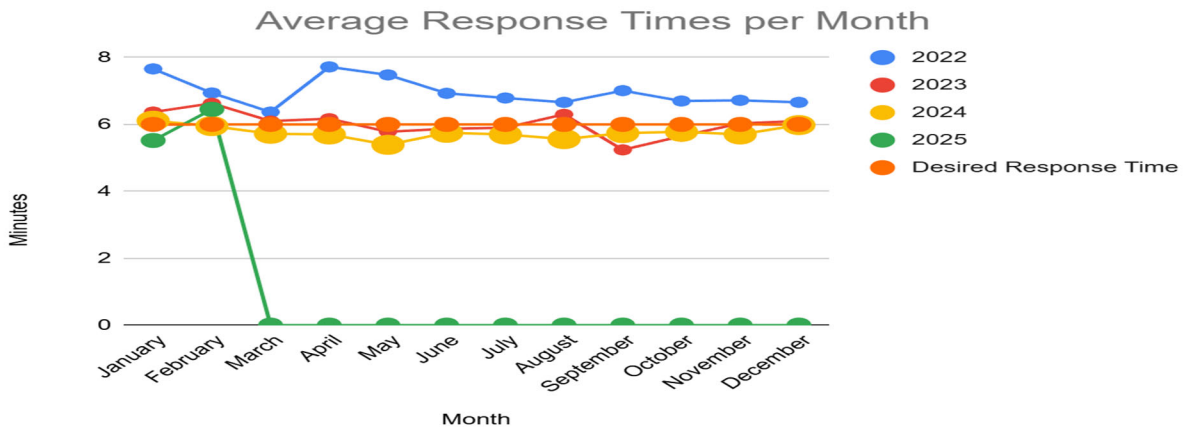
1. Calls for Service:

Updates:

- 1- EMS training was cancelled due to weather for Feb. Plan to make up with March's refresher
- 2- 100% of the monthly schedule was covered by at least 1 AEMT on duty,
- 3- 100% of the EMS responses were at the AEMT level.
- 4- We have started to staff the secondary ambulance as crew are able to cover.
- 5- We received Pediatric specific bags from WEMSA and the Cars Curing Kids organization and placed them on the ambulances.
- 6- Ambulance 641 is back from getting paint redone and back in service
- 7- Carolyn has got new Cradle Points (Wi-Fi connections), new antennas are being installed on Thursday March 6th. Tablets will go on ambulances after training on our refresher night.
