Evansville Tourism Commission Thursday, February 10, 2022 Virtual Meeting Via Google Meet

- 1. Call to order at 6:30 p.m.
- 2. Roll call: Abbey Barnes, Jim Brooks, Dianne Duggan, Nancy Nelson, Raj Patel, Christina Slaback, and Sue Berg. Guest: Collette Spranger

Several people responded to a call for committee participation issued through social media. A group that specializes in producing large-scale murals as a festival activity gave information to Nancy about costs and process. She has an informal inventory of "wall space" in Evansville. Consensus is to commission the second mural with a theme around Evansville's circus history. Sue Berg contacted a mural project manager for information; researched templates for contracts for artists and building owners, and attended the Historic Preservation meeting in January to describe the mural project. The intent for the first mural is to display and celebrate it during the May 6 Art Crawl.
 - e. Holiday lights update: Sue Berg reported that the tourism budget contributed \$9972, about half the cost of the holiday lights.
