1. **Call to Order:** Duggan and Sweeney called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

3. **Motion to approve the agenda by Corridon, second by Barnes. Motion passed unanimously.**

4. **Intergovernmental Agreement Between the Town of Porter and the City of Evansville.**

- A. **Public Hearing.** Duggan opened the public hearing at 6:06pm. Spranger shared comments submitted prior to the meeting by Brandon Rutz, 7901 N Tolles Rd, Town of Porter, who stated he was concerned there would be increased pressure around his property to develop into rural subdivisions. Warren and Denise Clobes, 7036 N Tolles Rd, asked if this would change their taxing jurisdiction or affect any services like electric or fire protection.
- B. **Discussion.** Spranger explained the rationale behind the boundary agreement and what the agreement would and would not do. The agreement pertains only to the City’s land division authority within the Town and adjusts its extraterritorial jurisdiction to a smaller area. The agreement will last 10 years. After 10 years, the parties can re-sign the agreement as is, re-negotiate, or dissolve the agreement. If dissolved, the extraterritorial area for the City will go back to what is allowed by state statute. The Town and City attorneys had brief comments on edits to the document, which both sides agree to.
- C. **Motion to Approve Resolution 2026-10 by Barnes, second by Droster. Motion passes unanimously.**
- D. **Motion to approve Town Resolution 33026, by Nelson, second by Sweeney. Motion passes unanimously.**
