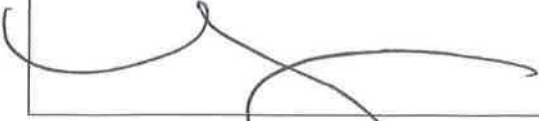

I would also like to raise an additional consideration regarding public safety outside of the building. Before temporary paper coverings were placed on the windows, I noticed that passing vehicles would slow significantly or come to a complete stop to look into the space out of curiosity about the activity inside. Given that Dysfunctional Fitness will host active group classes and movement-based training, it naturally draws attention from pedestrians and drivers.

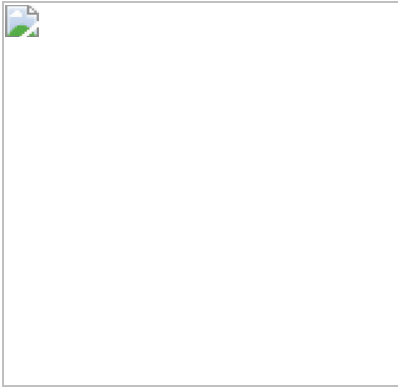
Because there is a crosswalk directly in front of the building on Main Street, I have concerns that unobstructed visibility into a highly active fitness environment could create unnecessary driver distraction. My concern is not only for the comfort and safety of those inside the facility, but also for the safety of pedestrians, cyclists, and motorists traveling through that area. In a busy downtown setting, even brief distractions can increase the risk of traffic congestion or accidents.

For these reasons, I believe the privacy film serves a dual purpose: protecting the privacy of members inside while also helping maintain safer traffic flow and attentiveness along this section of Main Street.

I do want to also address the verbiage and clarify the "privacy film", the proposed window treatment is not intended to create a darkened or fully blocked storefront appearance. The film is designed to maintain a bright, open atmosphere by allowing significant natural light to pass through both into and out of the facility. Rather than functioning as a blackout covering, it provides a softened, diffused view that preserves daylight while limiting direct visibility into detailed activity inside the space.

From the exterior, the building would still appear active and occupied, with movement and light visible through the windows. The intent is simply to create a level of visual privacy that prevents clear, close-up observation of members during workouts while maintaining an inviting and visually engaged street presence. This approach allows the business to contribute to the character of Main Street without creating a closed or concealed appearance.

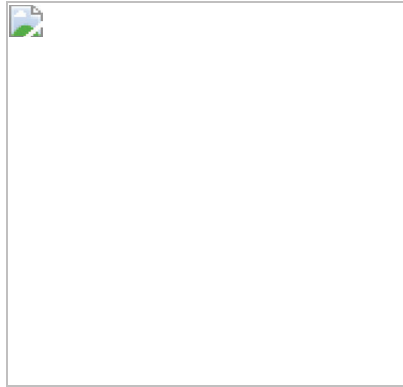

Hi Colette

Thank you for reviewing this and for suggesting a possible workaround.

I do understand the intent behind the B-2 window coverage provision; however, I would like to respectfully request consideration for full-height privacy film in this specific case.

Dysfunctional Fitness operates during very early morning hours, often beginning around 3:30 a.m., and the windows directly face residential apartments across the street. Because of this, there are legitimate privacy and safety concerns for both myself and my members. Many clients are

exercising in vulnerable positions, stretching, lifting, or participating in personal fitness work where privacy is important to their comfort and sense of security.

Leaving the lower portion of the windows uncovered would still allow direct visibility into the space from street level and from the apartments opposite the building, which would not adequately address those concerns.

My intention is not to create a closed-off storefront, but rather to balance visibility with the safety and privacy needs of a wellness-focused business operating during early hours.

Would there be an opportunity to request an exception, variance, or alternative interpretation given the unique operating conditions and privacy concerns associated with this use?

Hi Megan --

Are these privacy areas covering more than 50% of the window? We have a provision in the B-2 zoning district.

No more than 50% of a window of a first floor commercial space in the B-2 Central Business District shall be covered permanently with standard window treatments (e.g. blinds, curtains, etc.)

I have a quick work-around that would allow you to keep the privacy screen. Is it possible to leave the bottom of the window open and clear? (Essentially, cutting the yellow area below.) You could also see if you can get this screening with your logo in at least one of the panels. That might be good for getting people's attention.

To Whom It May Concern,

I am submitting this request for approval to demolish my existing detached garage and construct a new garage on my property located at the address listed above, within the City of Evansville Historic District.

Existing Structure Condition:

The current garage measures approximately 14 feet by 36 feet and is in a state of significant structural failure. The roof, walls, foundation, and roof truss have deteriorated to the point that substantial reconstruction would be required to make the structure safe and functional. Additionally, electrical service to the garage has been disconnected and is no longer operational.

Given the extent of these deficiencies, repair is not a practical or cost-effective option, and replacement is necessary.

Proposed Project Details:

I am proposing to:

- Demolish and remove the existing garage structure
- Construct a new detached garage measuring 30 feet by 36 feet
- Include two (2) overhead garage doors, each 10x8
- Install two (2) windows and one (1) service door
- Construct walls with a height of approximately 10 feet
- Install a new concrete foundation
- Add new electrical service to the structure
- Finish the exterior with metal siding and a metal roof, with colors selected to match or closely complement the existing house

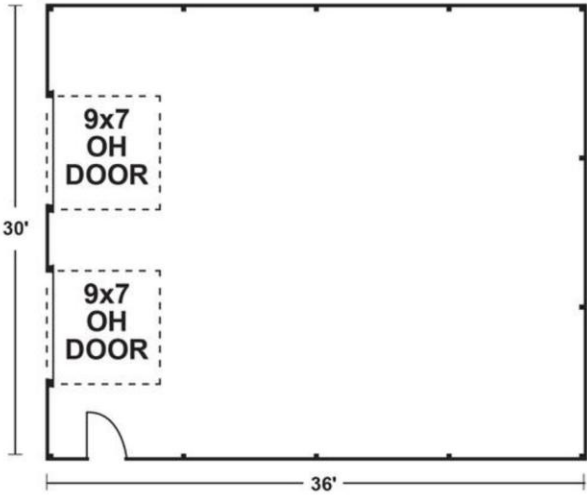
The design and materials have been selected with consideration for durability, functionality, and compatibility with the surrounding historic district.

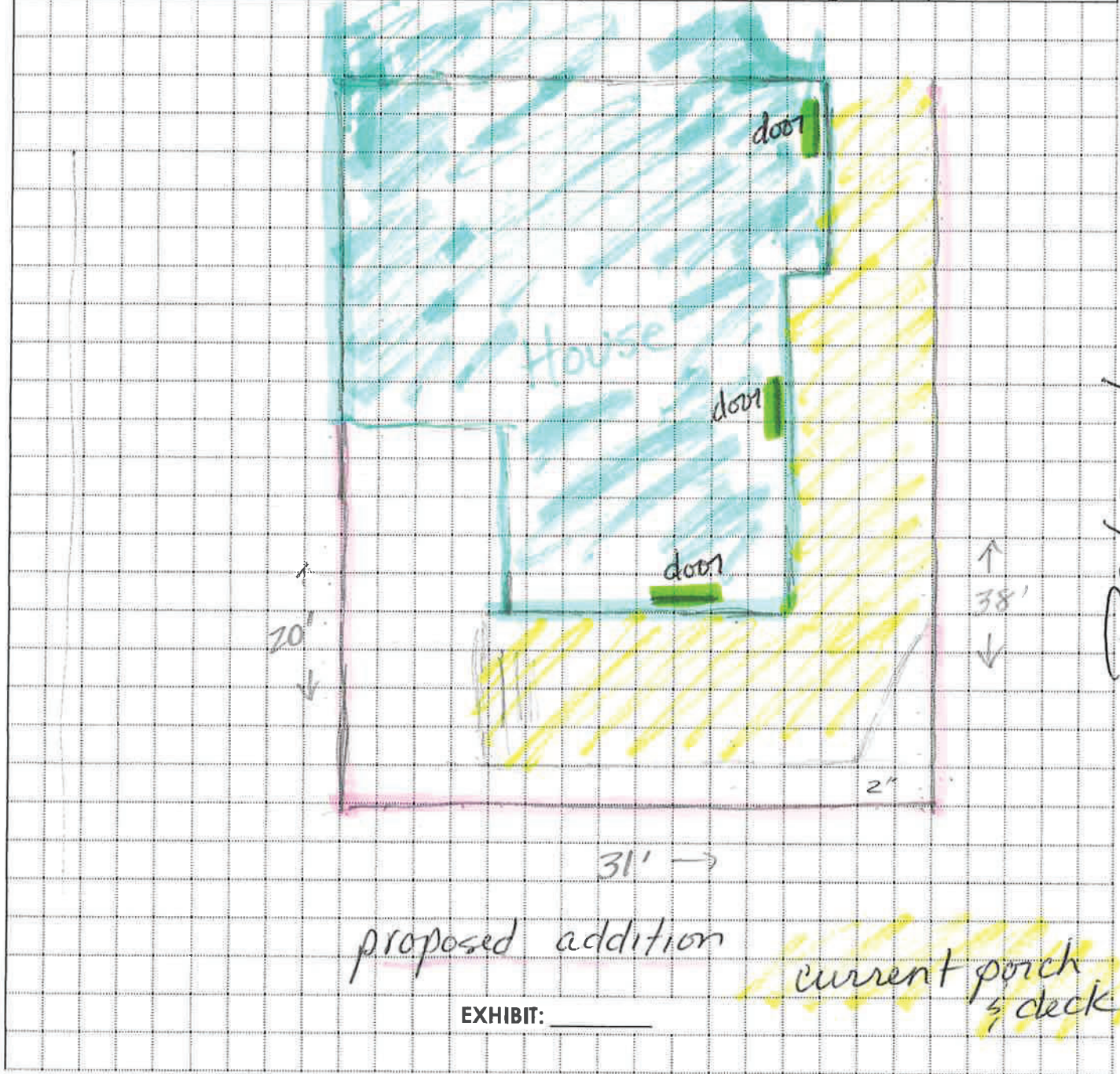

My name is Anne Kolasch, and we live at 39 Mill St in Evansville. I had planned to be at the regularly scheduled meeting, but am unable to attend the April 22nd meeting.

We are needing to repair our porch and deck, with plans for an addition in back (which is faces the alley)

I had turned in the paperwork to Collete.

I am looking at keeping the rounded posts, but want the railing to be uniform with the square spindles.

We will be using treated wood for the building materials.

Currently we have 19.5 feet of the old rounded spindles, which are rotting.
We currently have 34+ feet of the square spindles, not including the stair railings.
All of these materials were present when we purchased the home.

I feel uniformity is reasonable, and with the addition there will be 30 more feet in the alley and west side.
It is not feasible to spend money that we do not have on approximately 80 + feet of railing when 75 % that will be facing the alley and the neighbors 6' privacy fence. Monetary restraints have prevented repairs.

I have included photos of the existing materials on the house. The addition on the deck would wrap around to where the kennel area is in back.


Again, we plan to use the rounded posts, and want to use square railings and spindles.

We would be keeping similar style to our home and the homes in our neighborhood.
(I sent Colette a plethora of pictures showing square railings and posts on all of the homes)

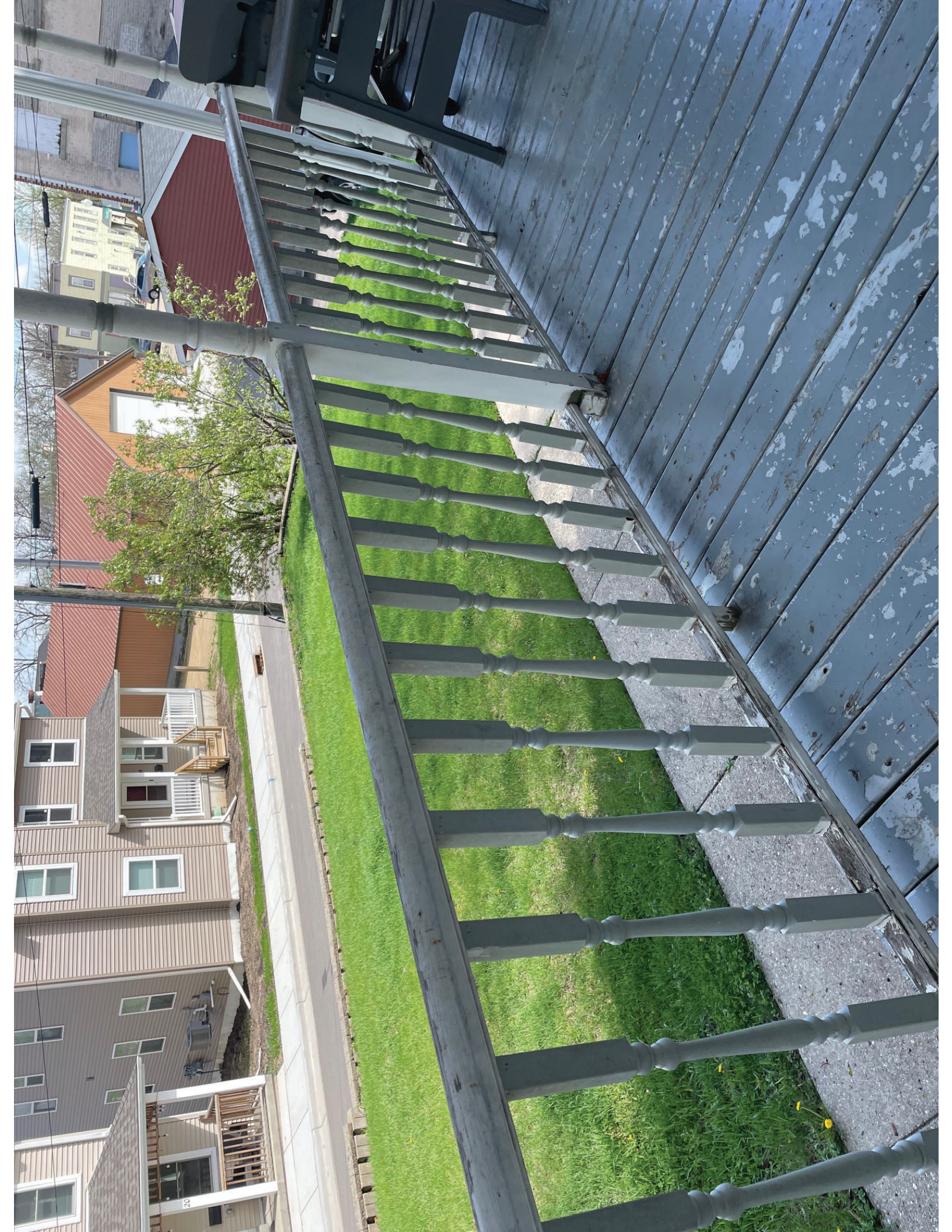

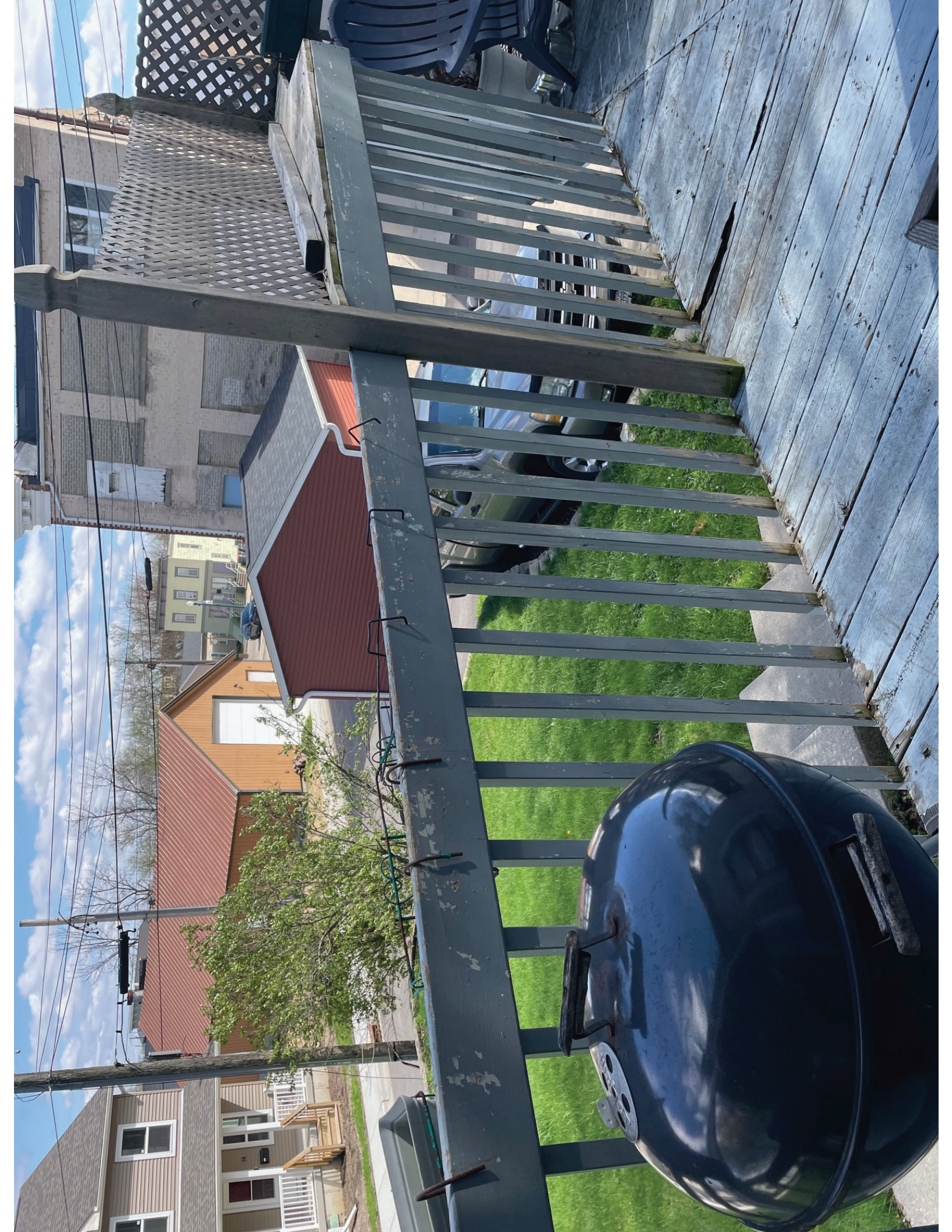

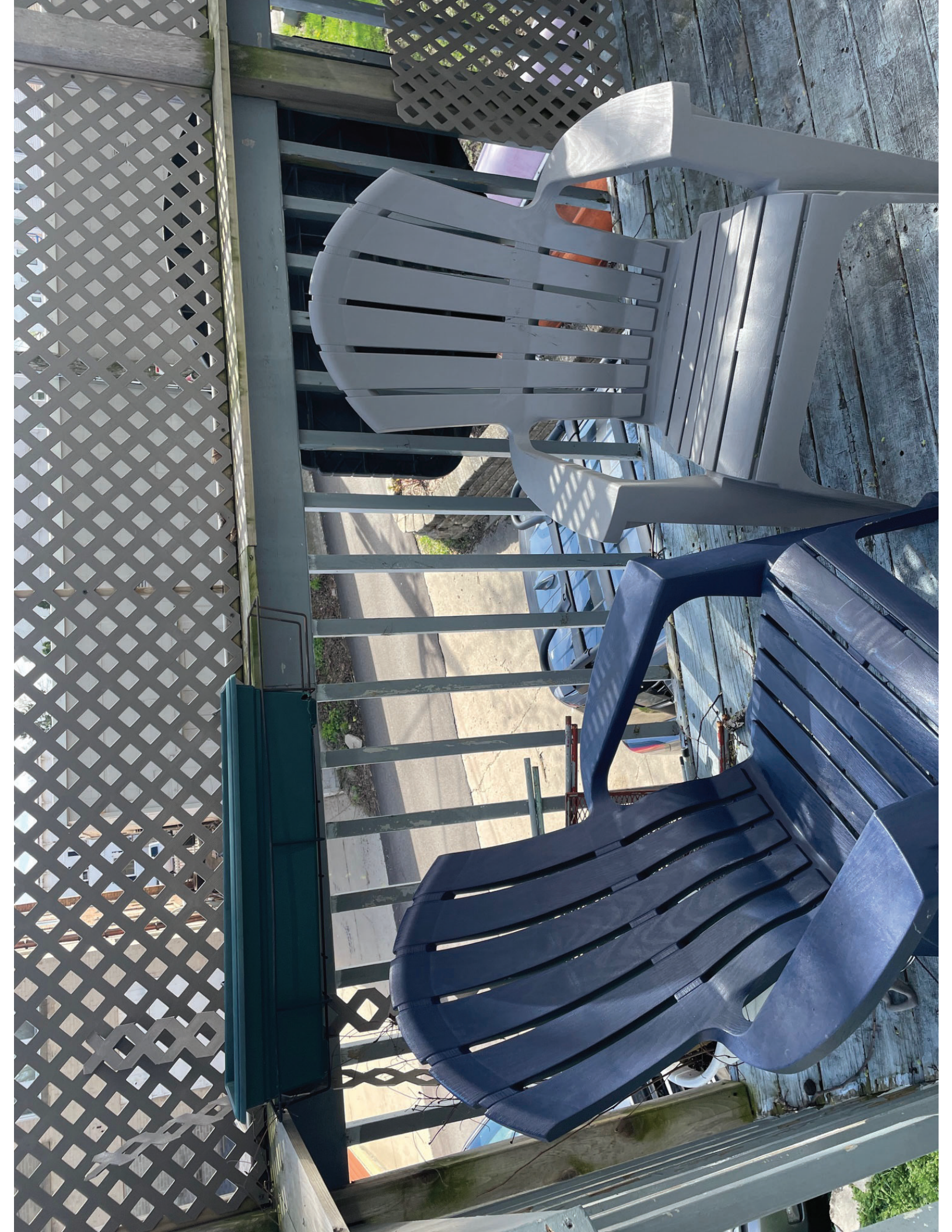
