In July the refresher was on Pediatric emergencies, EMS helped out on a senior project, Morgan taught a "Stop the Bleed" class for local business, Chief Kleisch is working on the EMS budget with Ryon and Jason.

(c) A written premise description along with a site plan describing the outdoor area sought to be added as an addendum to the licensed premises; said site plan, drawing or map also complying with and indicating all buildings and structures on the property, lot lines, setbacks, measurements, zoning uses or surrounding property, appropriate fencing, entrances and exits, safety and lighting, and any other requirements deemed necessary by the City Clerk, Chief of Police, or zoning officer. Premises for which a Temporary Class "B" beer or Temporary "Class B" wine license has been applied for on City property shall receive approval of the Common Council.

(d) The applicant shall have a certificate of insurance and shall name the City as an insured party as its interest may appear. The City Clerk shall be furnished with a copy of the certificate of insurance before the license is approved. Such coverage shall be primary and non-contributing with any insurance carried by the City.

(Code 1986, § 12.04(14), Ord2 2022-03, Ord. 2023-06)

Sec. 6-44. Operator's license.

(a) **Regular.** Application for an operator's license under § 125.17, Wis. Stats., shall state the name, residence, age, birthdate, and sex of the applicant, together with such other pertinent information as the City Clerk requires, and shall be issued by the Clerk for a period of no longer than two years to the renewal date of June 30, upon approval as detailed below.

(1) Submitted applications shall be referred by the City Clerk to the Police Department for review and recommendation. The Police Chief shall review each submitted application, perform a background check and recommend issuance or denial of the license.

(2) The Public Safety Committee will review the application and any recommendations from the Police Chief. The Public Safety Committee shall decide by majority of those voting whether to grant or deny a license to the applicant. The Public Safety Committee may attach any conditions and/or limitations to a granted operator license as they deem necessary.

(3) Upon the Public Safety Committee's approval the City Clerk shall issue a regular operator license to an applicant.

(4) If an application is denied the applicant must wait at least six (6) months before they can apply for another operator license.

(b) Provisional license.

(1) Application for a provisional operator's license under Wis. Stats. § 125.17(5) shall be made to the City Clerk and shall state the name, residence, age, birthdate and sex of the applicant, together with such other pertinent information as the City Clerk requires. The provisional license shall be issued by the City Clerk following a background check and an approval recommendation by the Chief of Police.

- (2) A provisional license shall be issued only to a person who has applied for an operator's license under this section. The provisional license shall expire sixty (60) days after its issuance or when the operator's license is issued, whichever is sooner.
- (3) The City Clerk or the Public Safety Committee may revoke the provisional license if it discovers that the holder of the provisional license made a false statement on the application for a provisional license or a regular operator's license.
- (4) The provisions of Wis. Stats. § 125.17(5) are hereby adopted in their entirety, and any conflict between this section and that statute as it may exist from time to time shall be resolved in favor of the statutory provision.

(c) Violations. The City has generally found convictions for the following offenses are substantially related to the duties and responsibilities associated with an operator's license. For purposes of these guidelines, any pending prosecution shall be treated as a conviction.

(1) **OWI** (all collectively referred to herein as "OWI"): Operating Under the Influence of an Intoxicant or Other Drugs, under Wis. Stat. § 346.63, local ordinances in conformity therewith, or other similar laws from other states, (commonly referred to as OWI, OWPBAC, PBAC, DWI, or DUI); or driving any vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or drugs; or injuring any person or damaging any property while driving under the influence of alcohol or other drugs.

a) The City has generally found OWI convictions within one (1) year of application for a License are grounds for denial of a License.

b) The City has also generally found two or more OWI convictions within five (5) years of application for a license can be grounds for denial of a License.

(2) **Underage Drinking:** Any underage drinking conviction which is the same as or similar to Wis. Stat. § 125.07(3) or (4) is substantially related to the duties and responsibilities associated with alcohol beverage licenses.

a) Any such underage drinking conviction within one (1) year of application for a license is typically grounds for denial.

b) Two or more such underage drinking convictions within five (5) year of application for a license are typically grounds for denial.

(3) **Service to Underage Persons.** Any service to underage persons conviction which is the same as or similar to Wis. Stat. § 125.07(1)(a) is substantially related to the duties and responsibilities associated with alcohol beverage licenses.

a) Two (2) or more service to underage persons within one (1) year of application for a License is typically grounds for denial.

(4) Drug Offense. The City has generally found that the following convictions are substantially related to the duties and responsibilities associated with alcohol beverage licenses: manufacturing, distributing or delivering a controlled substance or controlled substance analog under Wis. Stat. § 961.41(1); possessing with intent to manufacture, distribute or deliver, a controlled substance or controlled substance analog under Wis. Stat. § 961.41(1m); possessing, with intent to manufacture, distribute or deliver, or manufacturing, distributing or delivering a controlled substance or controlled substance analog under a federal law or law of another state that is substantially similar to Wis. Stat. § 961.41(1) or (1m); possessing any of the materials listed in Wis. Stat. § 961.65 with intent to manufacture methamphetamine under that section or under federal law or a law of another state that is substantially similar to Wis. Stat. § 961.65; or possessing controlled substances as regulated by Chapter 961, Wis. Stats.

a) The City has generally found such convictions within one (1) year of application for a License are grounds for denial.

b) The City has generally found two or more such convictions within five (5) years of application for License can be grounds for denial of a License.

(5) Overall Conviction Record, Felons, or Other Offenses. No operator's license shall be issued under this guideline to any person who has:

a) Been convicted of a felony that substantially relates to the circumstances of the licensed activity unless the person has been duly pardoned;

b) Been deemed a habitual law offender;

c) Convictions not specifically listed above shall also be grounds for denial of a License, as reasonably determined in the sound discretion of the City; or

d) Any intentionally or accidentally omitted any violation it will be considered a false application, resulting in the delay and or possible denial of the application.

Hold Harmless- The applicant agrees to indemnify, defend and hold the city and its employees and agents harmless against all claims, liability, loss, damage or expense asserted against or incurred by the city on account of any injury or death of any person or damage to any property caused by or resulting from the activities for which the license is granted. As evidence of the applicant's ability to perform the conditions of the license, the public safety committee may require the applicant to furnish a certificate of comprehensive general liability insurance with the city and its employees and agents as an additional insured. The insurance shall include coverage for a contractual liability with minimum limits in an amount as required by the public safety committee. The certificate of insurance shall provide 30 days written notice to the city upon cancellation, non-renewal or material change in policy.

Cancellation- The city, through its police department or other agents, may terminate, without prior notice, any use authorized by a street use license if the health, safety or welfare of the public appears to be endangered by activities generated by or associated with the use or if there are activities that violate any condition specified by the public safety committee when authorizing the issuance of the street use license.

Conclusion: Following the conclusion of the closure, any traffic control materials provided by the Municipal Services Department, shall be placed in the Right of Way, so as not to obstruct pedestrian or vehicle traffic, by the party responsible.

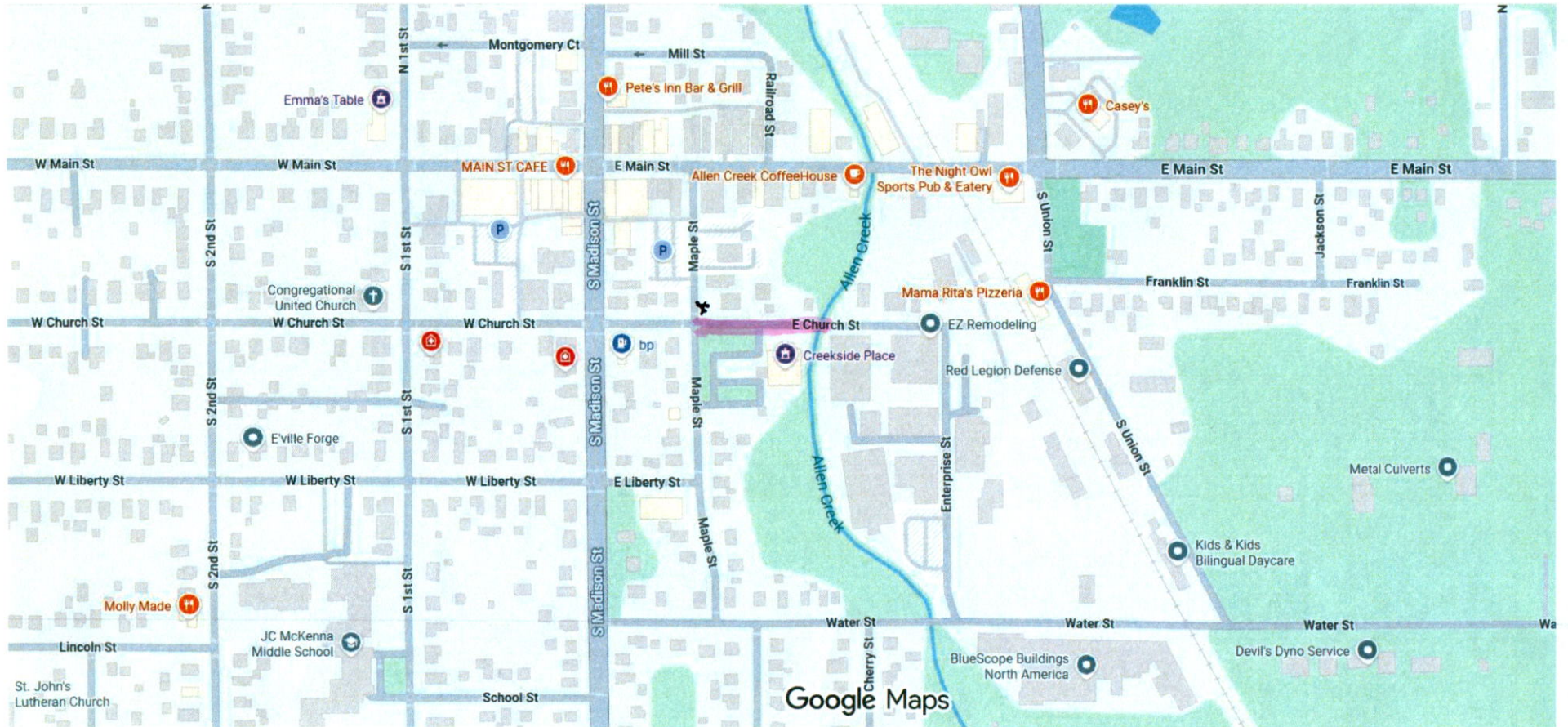

**JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT
256.35(9) Wis. Stats**

ROCK COUNTY AND CITY OF EVANSVILLE

Rock County (County) and City of Evansville (Municipality) have combined with other municipalities to establish a sophisticated telecommunications system which automatically connects a person dialing the first "911" to a public safety answering point (PSAP) provides the PSAP with the caller's location and number identification.

Wis. Stats. 256.35(9) requires that County and Municipality annually enter into this Joint Powers Agreement as follows:

- 1) This agreement is applicable on a daily basis.
- 2) If an emergency service vehicle is dispatched in response to a request through the Rock County System, which the Municipality is a part of, such vehicle shall render its services to the persons needing the services regardless of whether the vehicle is operating outside the vehicle's normal jurisdictional boundaries. The intent of this paragraph is to meet the legal requirements of the Wisconsin State Statutes. It is not to assign calls to emergency service departments outside of their defined service areas on a regular basis. Only unusual circumstances will require such assignment.
- 3) Municipality directs the Rock County PSAP Center receiving a call for service in the Municipality's jurisdiction to dispatch the call in the following manner.

Primary:	Police:	County Main Repeater 155.985 (TX), 159.090 (RX)
	Fire:	RF Main 153.950 (RX), 155.715 (TX)
		RF Paging 154.310 (RX), PL Tone 79.7
	EMS:	Same as Fire

Secondary: Police: County TAC Repeater 154.950 (TX), 158.730 (RX)

Fire: RF Central 150.815 (TX), 155.430 (RX)

EMS: Same as Above

- 4) All calls of an administrative nature shall be referred to Municipality's published telephone number as follows:

Administrative: Police: 882-2292

Fire: 882-9934

EMS: 882-2269

- 5) The Rock County PSAP will maintain a record of the receipt of all 911 calls, emergency and non-emergency, and a record of the dispatch. Municipality must keep records of the receipt of the dispatch and disposition.
- 6) Rock County will file a copy of this Agreement with the Wisconsin Department of Justice as required by sec. 256.35(9), Wis. Stats.

The respective Board/Council has authorized this Joint Powers Agreement and the undersigned have been authorized to execute this Agreement effective January 1, 2027.

➤ **Notable calls:**

- EV2609036 – Ofc. Schmidt investigated a fraud from a local business involving four counterfeit checks being cashed. A check from the business was stolen from the mail, washed, and used as a template for checks consisting of the following amounts: \$8,878.35, \$9,145.70, \$7,500.44, and \$8,878.35. All four checks were cashed at banks in the Rockford, IL and Chicago, IL areas, but the Evansville business reported no money was taken from their account. Due to the extent of this incident, this case has been turned over to the FBI as well as the United States Postal Service.
- EV2609210 – Sgt. Tway and Ofc. Derrickson received a call for a traffic complaint approaching the city limits after a vehicle was seen traveling into oncoming traffic, almost hitting mailboxes, and not stopping at stop signs. Sgt. Tway located the vehicle and conducted a traffic stop at Kwik Trip where the driver was later arrested for Operating While Intoxicated 1st Offense. The driver was also issued a citation for Operating with a Prohibited Alcohol Concentration. It should also be known that the driver was operating the vehicle with her 5-year-old daughter in the vehicle who was turned over to a family member.
- EV2609211 – After completing the OWI investigation above, Ofc. Derrickson was dispatched to Pete's Inn after a vehicle was called in for hitting an electrical pole wire in the alleyway/parking lot by the bar. It should be known that several patrons from within Pete's came outside and were engaging with the RP while she was on the phone with dispatch. It was reported that the patrons were mad at the RP for calling the police, despite the driver hitting a wire to an electrical pole with his vehicle then leaving the scene to go into his nearby apartment. Derrickson eventually located the driver and conducted Standardized Field Sobriety Testing before arresting him for Operating While Intoxicated 3rd Offense. The driver also received a citation for Operating with a Prohibited Alcohol Concentration.

- EV2609245 – Sgt. Johnson and Ofc. Nankee were dispatched to a burglary in progress at 179 E Main St for four juveniles that broke into a city owned building. All four boys were arrested and issued citations for Trespass to Land.
- EV2609511 – Sgt. Johnson and Ofc. Nankee investigated a disturbance in which an intoxicated male was punching holes in the walls of his house and being verbally abusive towards his wife. During the investigation, it was discovered that the male punched the wall right next to his wife's head during an argument. The male also approached Ofc. Nankee with closed fists upon his arrival to the scene, but he was taken into custody without issue and arrested for Domestic Disorderly Conduct and Domestic Criminal Damage to Property.
- EV2609605 – Ofc. Ritter and Ofc. Derrickson were dispatched to a fight in progress between a male and female. Upon arrival, the female half informed Ofc. Derrickson that she and her boyfriend got into an argument that turned physical when the boyfriend choked her and while doing so said, "I'm gonna strangle you bitch." The female got away, grabbed a knife, and left the residence claiming she thought it would be better if she wasn't around. The male half was ultimately arrested for Domestic Battery, Domestic Disorderly Conduct, and Domestic Criminal Damage to Property.
- EV2609657 – Ofc. Schmidt, Lt. Reilly, and Sgt. Johnson investigated a burglary at the Gas N Go gas station in which a suspect removed a window from the building and stole multiple vapes as well as alcohol. Upon reviewing security camera footage, the suspect can be seen inside the store without his mask on and it was determined the suspect was likely a juvenile. Lt. Reilly and Sgt. Johnson collected DNA samples from fingerprints on the window that was removed and the boxes of the three vapes that were taken from inside and discarded on the ground outside. Later in the week, Sgt. Johnson and Ofc. Hanson were assisting the Rock County Sheriff's Office with a call involving a suicidal juvenile subject. During the investigation, Ofc. Hanson discovered the juvenile's mom found a number of vapes and alcohol in her son's room that matched the items taken from Gas N Go. Lt. Reilly later had her review the security camera footage of the burglary suspect and she was able to identify the suspect as her son. Multiple charges were issued for the 13-year-old suspect including burglary and theft.
- EV2609855 – Sgt. Johnson and Ofc. Hanson were requested by the Rock County Sheriff's Office to assist with responding to a call for a 13-year-old subject who was armed with a knife and threatening suicide. Sgt. Johnson and Ofc. Hanson arrived on scene before the deputies as they were approximately 10-15 minutes away and took the juvenile into custody without incident. As mentioned above, it was during this time Ofc. Hanson obtained information from the juvenile's mom



that he was potentially the suspect from the burglary at Gas N Go earlier in the week. The juvenile was turned over to the Sheriff's Office without issue.

- EV2609865 – Ofc. Hanson was dispatched to a loud noise complaint at 38 N Madison St, which has been an on-going issue at this location all year. Ofc. Hanson made contact at the residence where the loud noise was coming from and informed them they would be receiving a citation for the noise. After clearing from the complex, Ofc. Hanson was called back to the residence due to the members of both apartments getting into an argument and that one of the individuals was banging on/punching their shared wall. Upon returning to the apartment complex, Ofc. Hanson discovered the male half that originally complained about the noise had armed himself with a knife and threatened to slash the other residents' throats. Despite the threat to slash their throats, the male remained in the doorway of his residence and never attempted to harm anyone with the knife. It was determined that all subjects involved would be receiving disorderly conduct citations and no arrests were made.
- EV2610016 – During the investigation of the suicidal 13-year-old above, the juvenile's mother also informed Ofc. Hanson that her son was at Pete's Inn around 1:00am on an unknown date in the last three weeks playing on the gambling machines. The mother discovered this after she found her son made unauthorized purchases with one of her cards at Pete's. It should be known that no calls were made to the police department from anyone at Pete's regarding a 13-year-old being inside the bar alone around 1:00am nor that he was playing on the gambling machines.

➤ **Admin update:**

- Lt. Reilly and Chief Jones have been working on implementing a new program that handles scheduling, FTO documentation, transcribing report dictations, fleet management, among other things.
- The PD copy/fax machine has arrived and been installed.
- Chief Jones and Lt. Reilly have been working on switching from T-Mobile to AT&T FirstNet after connectivity issues and poor customer service from T-Mobile.
- Lt Reilly attended the Rock County Law Enforcement Administrators meeting. The District Attorney's Office is looking to implement "Seek then Speak". This is an online resource for sexual assault victims to make a report and find the appropriate agency to give the report to.
- Chief Jones and Lt Reilly met with other department heads to discuss our Emergency Operations Plan with Carolyn.

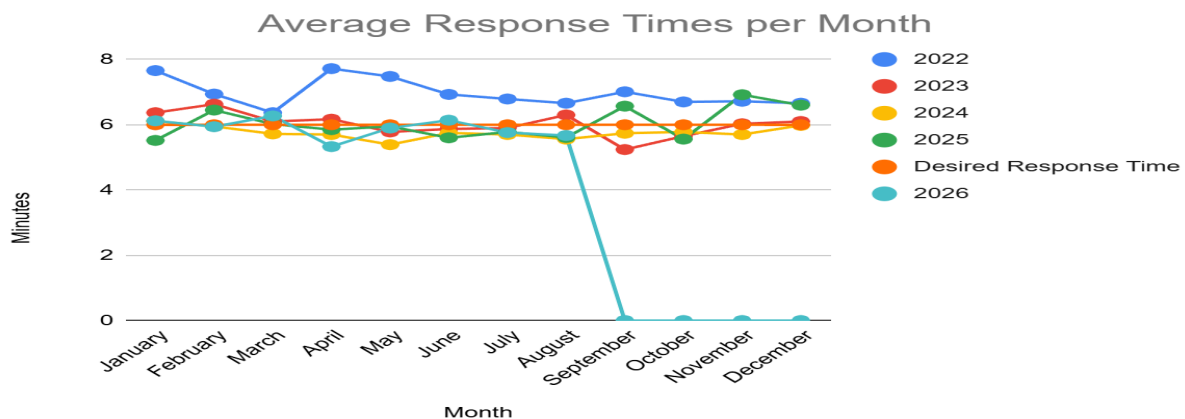
