Officer Training:

- All sworn staff have completed or are in the process of completing Drug Endangered Children in a Rural Environment. This is free training put on by the Department of Justice
- Nov 3rd and 4th Lt. Jones and Chief Reese will be in the Dells to attend the Police and Fire Commission workshop. We will attend public safety virtual on Nov 4th
- Officer Blom has moved into phase three of field training. He will be on a second and dayshift swing during this phase of his training

Community Relations:

- Officer Nankee is doing some in-service training with the ECSD on drug impairment recognition
- Drug take back/Trunk or Treat event was popular at Creekside Place. We collected 104.6lbs of drugs since our last take back event
- Planning for shop w/ a cop is still underway and as of 10/26/21 we've received \$800.00

Monthly Update:

Technology/Equipment/Building Update:

- Two of our squads needed some minor repairs this month. 1) for stop sticks remounting and 2) for a lighting issue
- One of our old handheld radar units will need replacing in the near future. Those are approximately \$900.00
- Vivant Health donated an opioid emergency kit to be placed in our Evidence Intake room free of charge.
- The quotes for a new generator the most inexpensive quote was \$54,800. We only have \$28,125 in the budget for this project

- WE Energies was in to replace our gas meter

- Chief Reese is wrapping up a background on a potential part time officer. There will be a Police Commission meeting on November 15th to discuss and possibly appoint the individual. That will get us up to 2 working part time officers. Chief Reese will likely start a hiring process to fill the remaining 2 part time positions in December or January
